

Overview

Avit Flight Academy (formerly AeroTrek) was founded in 2016 on the principles of safety, youth opportunity, and relationships. With a fleet of 29 aircraft, Avit Flight Academy serves the communities around Wadsworth, Akron-Canton, Wayne County, and Mansfield airports. In 2022, Avit logged 9,000 hours of flight time and completed over 75 FAA checkrides.

Avit was one of 16 recipients nationwide of the FAA's Workforce Development Grant program. A federal award of \$77,000 provided funding for classroom equipment and two 8-week ground schools for local 9th and 10th grade students. Each student had the opportunity to log their first two flight lessons, tour facilities, and explore what it takes to become a professional pilot. Learn more here.

What leads to success?

"Having great partnerships is critical. With the airports, the FBO's, the communities... Everyone shares a growth and service mindset, and maintains a common endeavor, and if you can achieve a "5-way win" the success of which is mutual. The growth of a school, is growth of an airport, and of a community.

I think a sponsor, operator, and school often want the same thing. A successful flight school offers based aircraft, activity, and purpose."

Where are the challenges?

"An airport is, quite literally, the front door of our operation. Having safe and functioning facilities are important. From the condition of the pavement and hangar doors, to the FBO. It doesn't need to be new and fancy, but safe, reliable, and clean. It build trust with the students.

Among other things, we are always interested in aircraft leaseback opportunities. I believe we will need at least ten more aircraft by the end of 2023. We have a team of investors in this way and couldn't do it without them."
